

50 Ways To Tell If A Girl In Class Likes You

1. Stares At You In Class Often

She may have a seat that is relatively far from yours but you notice that she tends to stare at you when you are in class with her. She will turn her head if she has to in order to get a good view of you. The teacher may be teaching something but she doesn't seem to be paying attention at all. She seems to be zoned in on you and may even appear as though she is distant in thought.

2. Sits Closer To You

She finds a way to sit closer to you in class. She could have found any other place to sit in the class that was available but she always seems to find a seat that is close to yours. She wants to be closer to you and hopes that you notice her physical presence. Perhaps at some point you will decide to talk to her and the both of you can begin the process of getting to know each other.

3. Plays With Her Hair

She may be in the habit of running her fingers through her hair while glancing in your direction from time to time. She does this in order to have something to focus on while you are in class with her. She is also showing that she is slightly nervous and is just trying to find a way to calm herself down. When she focuses on her hair, she has something else to direct her attention to and that really helps her.

4. Asks To Borrow Something From You

She has a habit of borrowing things from you. You may notice that she has asked if she can borrow a pen, eraser, piece of paper, etc, from you in the last few weeks or months. She could have asked anyone else to lend her these items but she always seems to ask you. This is how she is able to get your attention. She hopes that by asking to borrow these items from you, you become aware of her presence and you start acknowledging her whenever you are both in class.

5. Asks You To Pass Something To Her

There may be something in class that she is trying to get to or she wants to have. Perhaps there is a textbook that is sitting nearby that she needs to get to or there is a chair somewhere that is unoccupied and she wants to move it to where she is located at. She may ask you to help by passing that item to her. She does this in order to have some kind of interaction with you in the hopes that you notice her.

6. Sitting In Class First

She is always seemingly at her seat in class before you get there. It is almost like no matter how early you get to class, she is already there. She does this in order to get a good look at you when you walk in. She also hopes that you notice her sitting there talking to her friends or waiting on the teacher and you acknowledge her in some way.

7. Friend Looks At You In Class

You may be noticing that one of her friends if not more of them tends to look at you in class. They stare at you constantly almost as though they want you to look at them. This is normally how her friends show you that she likes you and has been talking about you to them. They are basically checking you out and what you are doing. They are also trying to observe your mannerisms so that they are able to tell her what you were doing in class during break or whether you were looking at her.

8. Friend Asks You About Yourself

Her friends may have taken a particular interest in you. All of a sudden, it seems like one or more of them is constantly interacting with you in class. They may be asking you about what other classes you are taking or whether you are engaged in sports or other school activities. They seem to want to know more about you. This is how they gather more information about you so that they can go to her later on and tell her about you.

9. Friend Asks If You Have A Girlfriend

Being that she isn't brave enough to do this herself and she doesn't want to appear to be too obvious, she may have one of her friends ask you if you have a girlfriend. You may not have expected this from her friend but at the same time you see no reason not to be honest with her with your response. Her friend will then go to her and let her know whether you have a girlfriend or not.

10. Bumps Into You

She will try to find a way to have some physical contact with you. You may notice that she tends to bump into you as you are about to head into class or while you are in class. She just has this habit of bumping into you. There may be physical contact or not. She may tell you that she is sorry in the process and even smile. However, the idea was to get your attention. She hopes that at some point, you get curious about her and start asking her questions about herself or at least introduce yourself to her.

11. Compliments You In Class

She has a way of constantly complimenting you about something you did in class. Perhaps you were really good at answering a particular question and she compliments you for the answer you gave. Perhaps you did very well on a test or exam and she compliments you on that as well. She seems to go out of her way to make you feel good by letting you know that you did a great job at something.

12. Volunteers Her Help

You may need help moving something in class or putting something up and she always seems to be the first one to offer her help to you. You have noticed that she does this often and you may not have been even looking in her direction when she offered her help. In other words, it just kind of comes out of nowhere. You may not have even been asking for help at the time but clearly needed it and she is right there beside you helping you out. She wants you to notice her and like her for what she is doing.

13. Touches You

She touches you as often as she can. She tries to do this in a subtle way. You may be handing over something to her, perhaps an assignment from the teacher and she always finds a way to touch your hand or a part of your body in the process. Instead of just taking what you were giving her, she touches you as well. This is how she tries to create physical contact with you in the hopes that you sense it and you look at her with a smile.

14. Asks You Questions

She wants you to feel like you are the smartest guy in the class. Hence, she often asks you questions in class. She may ask you about a particular problem in a particular subject that she is trying to figure out or about what your answer was to a particular question that you were both given on assignment. She will find ways to ask you questions related to class in order to let you know that she values your intelligence. She hopes to boost your confidence by doing this and get you to talk to her more often.

15. Asks You About Your Extra-Curricular Activities

If she has gotten to the point where she feels comfortable enough around you, she starts asking you about activities that you may be engaging in that isn't just studies. Perhaps you are part of a school club or sports team. She tries to use the school as her cover. Thereby, she asks about your extra-curricular activities but she hopes that the conversation will eventually progress to talking about other subjects that don't relate to class or school.

16. Looks At You When You Are Talking To Other Girls In Class

She watches you quite closely when you are engaged in conversation with other girls in class. She does it because she is worried that you may like one or more of those girls. She watches to see how your body responds to them and what you talk about to them. 17. Talks Loud

She hopes that she gets your attention doing this and you are able to turn your head toward her direction. At that moment that you turn toward her, she may take a quick glance at you just to see if you have noticed her.

18. Laughs Loud

The joke that she was told by whoever in class may not have been all that funny but she is laughing really loud. She has a habit of laughing really loud when she is told stories or something that may or may not be that funny. She wants to get your attention when she does this and will often look in your direction to see if you heard her. She hopes to establish eye contact with you in these moments and possibly smile at you before getting back into the conversation she was already having.

19. Gets Animated

There are moments when she just seems to get a little bit melodramatic when she is talking to her friends in class. It's almost like she is in the theatre and she is using her body to act and play out what she is describing. She gets this animated because she wants to get your attention. She wants you to look over and wonder what story she could be telling. She may glance in your direction from time to time to see if you are noticing what she is doing.

20. Brings Snacks

She hands out snacks to her friends and then has them give some to the other class members including you. They make it a point to say her name as they give it to you so that you know who brought the snacks to class. You are then going to look over in her direction and she may be looking your way at that very moment. She hopes that you nod or at least smile at her for her kind gesture. This is how she hopes that she is getting you to notice her and possibly like her.

21. Wants To Be On Your Team

When assignments in class are divided into teams, she tends to volunteer to be on your team. She may use the cover of bringing along a friend of hers to join the team as well but she knows exactly what she is doing. By constantly being a part of your class team, she is able to get closer to you and have an excuse to talk to you and have you talk to her.

22. Wants You To Lead

She may encourage you to lead the team and be the one to do the presentation in front of the class. She wants you to know that she believes in you and even trusts you. She also wants to see how good of a leader you can be. Thereby, in some ways, this is also a way by which she tests you and your ability to handle that kind of responsibility.

23. Leaves Class Around The Same Time You Do

She has a way of always heading for the door exit around the same time you do. She does this in order to have you see her and start noticing her. She may use her friend as cover and have her friend also accompany her towards the exit but she is hoping that she meets you at the exit. She hopes that this will cause you to look in her direction and perhaps even start a conversation with her.

24. Asks Your Friend About You

You may have a friend who has told you that this particular girl keeps asking him questions about you. You may have ignored this at first but now your friend is telling you this more often. She may be asking him about where you are from and what part of town you live. She may even be asking him if you are in a relationship.

25. Hangs Out Where You Hang Out

There may be a place locally that you tend to hang out with your friends. All of a sudden, you notice that this particular girl is now hanging out at the exact same place with her friends. You have never noticed her there before until now. You are wondering what she is doing there because she doesn't strike you as the kind of girl who would hang out at a place like this. She is doing this in the hopes that your eyes are drawn to her and you start wondering about her.

26. Friends Come Over To Socialize With Your Group

She may send a few of her friends to socialize with your group at this hang out spot. She does this in order to get her friends to become more acceptable to your friends. She is also watching you to see if you look in her direction while her friends are there. If you are not paying that much attention to her friends but looking in her direction instead, she knows that you probably like her.

27. Friends Befriend Your Friends

She takes this further and has her friends befriend yours. You will now notice that several of her friends start taking a keen interest in your group. They may all decide to start eating lunch with your group in the cafeteria or they may start organizing meet-ups with your group outside of class. She knows that this is one of the ways that she can get into your inner circle. She may not be in the forefront of these attempts but she is still a part of her group and she hopes to get closer to you this way.

28. Boasts In Class

She may start talking about all the important groups she is a part of in school or what awards she won recently. She is saying this to the people around her during conversation in class but she is also hoping that you hear her. If she is a cheerleader, she will let that be known. If she is part of the student council, she lets that be known. She will boast about anything like this because she wants you to realize that she is someone important in school and you would be wise to start talking to her.

29. Glances Back At You

If you tend to sit behind her, she will often find a way to look behind her from time to time. She may use the excuse of trying to talk to a friend behind her when in fact she is stealing glances in your direction as well. She may turn around and ask someone behind her to help her get something that she can't reach or she may just be acting as though she is staring at one of the photos on the wall. She will try to look your way from time to time as she does all this.

30. Volunteers To Hand Out Class Assignments

She is typically one of the few that tends to hand out class assignments from the teacher. She does this in order to have an excuse to get to your desk. You know that she likes you in particular when she always lingers at your desk or finds a reason to ask you about something or tell you something when she is about to hand over a class assignment to you. 31. Asks Your Opinion

She may be in the habit of asking your opinion about something. Her friend may have told her a funny story about something intriguing and she realized that you were listening to the story. 32. Licks Her Lips

She may not be consciously aware that she does this when she is staring at you from time to time. However, she will lick her lips briefly from time to time when she is looking at you. She may be trying to find a way to relieve the tension at that moment. She may be fantasizing about you and doesn't realize how much that fantasy is affecting her body language.

33. Adjusts Her Body

She is constantly moving around on her seat. She doesn't seem to be able to find a position that she is willing to stay at for a sustained period of time. Every time she makes an adjustment, she may glance in your direction. This is how she hopes to get your attention and get you to start thinking about her. She wants you to know that she exists.

34. Asks How You Did On A Test

She may not care about how anyone else did on a test but she cares about how you did. She makes it a habit to ask you from time to time how you did. She is being snooppy for sure but she also does it because she wants to have the opportunity to tell you that you did a good job. Even if you were to tell her a grade that wasn't all that good, she still finds a way to praise you for it. This is how she gets you to know that she is supportive of you.

35. Gives You The Scoop

She tends to want to keep you in the know as far as what is going on in class or the school campus. If she is the talkative type, she will typically tell you about the latest news with faculty or the students. Whatever you run for in class or volunteer for, you always seem to have her vote. She doesn't seem to question your ability to do the job. It's almost as though you have obtained her approval and support without you having to prove anything. There is a sense that you always have her undying loyalty and the benefit of the doubt.

42. Gets Her Friends To Vote For You

She wants you to see just how much she supports you so that you really begin to feel like she is worthy of your approach and your time.

You so happen to hear that she is having an event and you are getting this account from her friend. Her friend consequently tells you that you are invited to the event. 46. Asks For Rides

49. Gives You Lingering Hugs

She is often giving you the kind of hugs that she doesn't give to anyone else in class. Her hugs tend to last a lot longer than the hugs that she gives her other classmates. It's almost like she just wants to stay in that hug with you for a good long while. In fact, you may have to be the one who breaks up the hug from time to time.
